College of Excellence

The Founder of the GRG Trust, Sri. G.R. Govindarajulu, following the footsteps of his illustrious parents, started a high school for girls in 1956 in Peelamedu, Coimbatore. Growing in popularity and driven by the desire of the public, the school blossomed into a full-fledged college for women. Thus was started PSGR Krishnammal College for Women on 28th June 1963 under the auspices of the GRG Trust. Sri G.R. Govindarajulu was the Founder Trustee and Smt. Chandrakanthi Govindarajulu, the Founder Correspondent of the college.

Affiliated to the Bharathiar University in Coimbatore, PSGRKCW is situated as a beautiful, serene, and verdant campus. Over a period of nearly 60 years, it has grown into a full-fledged first grade post graduate-research institution with well-equipped laboratories, two excellent modern libraries, an extensive well-maintained playground and a world-class indoor sports arena. The college offers 33 UG, 15 PG and 13 MPhil/PhD Programmes. The total student strength is around 8,000.

Due to the untiring efforts of the founders and their family members, the college in the second year of its inception (1964) was upgraded to a First Grade college. This is the first women's college in this area to start MA (Literature) in 1969, B.Com in 1970 and BBM in 1987, exclusively for women. Another pioneering initiative at the state level is the starting of MBA Programme exclusively for women during 1993-94. The MBA programme of PSGRKCW has now been internationally accredited by the ACBSP, USA in 2019.

To ensure quality enhancement to make quality an inherent aspect of the institution, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) was constituted in January 2004. Autonomy in 2004, ISO 9001:2000 certification in March 2007, accreditation with "A"

grade by NAAC, and ISO 9001:2015 certification in 2018 have been the modest but reaffirming assurances in the vertical climb of the institution towards excellence.

The Botany programme has been elevated to the status of DST-FIST sponsored in 2009. In 2011, the college was awarded “College with Potential for Excellence” status by UGC. This was followed by a celebrated elevation for science programmes with the inclusion under the “StarStatusScheme”oftheDBT in 2012. The institution has entered into new ventures with UGC sanctioning skill-enhancing programmes through BVoc (in two disciplines) and a Community College in 2014. A Rural Women Technology Park (DST-sponsored) has been launched to empower women in rural areas through technology transfer and entrepreneurship.

PSGRKCW was awarded with “College of Excellence” status by UGC in 2016 and has been ranked #10 among colleges in the country in NIRF 2020. All the five science programmes and three computer science programmes have been granted Star status by the Department of Biotechnology (DBT). Most recently, the college has been ranked #5 among government and government-aided colleges in ARIIA 2020.

B.Voc. DEGREE PROGRAMMES

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has launched a scheme in skills development based higher education as part of college/university education, leading to Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) Degree with multiple exits such as Diploma, Advanced Diploma and B.Voc Degree under the National Skill Qualification Frame work (NSQF). The B.Voc. CHANDRAKANTHI CENTRE FOR DEVELOPMENT AND EXCELLENCE

To equip future generation for their successful employment and develop their personality along with their academics, **Personality Development Program** has been introduced for all three years. First Year program is split into two modules I Semester - Communicative English (40 Hours) & II Semester Effective English Communication (30Hours). Second Year- General Aptitude for Campus Placement (40 Hours).Third year – Soft skill for Campus Placement (40 Hours). The centre aims at high-quality plan of the whole instructional approach of the various programmes offered in the college in tune with National Programme on Technology Education Learning. The e-contents with combination of sounds, images and text prepared by our faculty members provide free online video lectures in science and humanity courses and are made available in learningmanagementportal24x7toourstudents.

LANGUAGE LAB

PSGR Krishnammal College for Women established the Language Lab in the year 2008, which is a language training platform to maximize practical learning of language and language-oriented skills. Lady Hawk software is installed in the lab to expand activity based learning amidst first and second year students of under graduation. Every year, around 3500 students get benefitted by getting trained through the language software to learn various languages like English, French and German. Language Lab allows students to practice language with a much wider variety of activities and exercises using online modules. Different modes of activities like audio exercises, video exercises and audio-visual materials are programmed to equip the users. The students can watch videos, practice their pronunciation through a speech recognizer, learn new vocabulary, and work out the grammatical tasks and they can also have a record of their scores. The platform is tailored to the individual needs of students. On the other hand, the monitoring and evaluation pattern incorporate in the system said the teacher identify the areas of difficulties students encounter during the course of language learning process.

Teachers know the progress of each student and receive reports of their strengths and weaknesses which enable bettering the skills. Individual activity tracking is enabled which facilitates accurate assessment of each student's performance record. This improves the language standards of the students and on the other hand, the teacher is able to have the records of progression for each student and of the entire class aswell.

Rules of Admission / Withdrawal

1. Candidates for admission to the degree class should have passed the XII Standard or Pre-Degree examination or its equivalent declared eligible by the Bharathiar University for admission to the degree course.
2. Students who are found to have obtained admission by false representations will be dismissed with forfeiture of all fees paid.
3. No student will be enrolled or permitted to attend classes until the fee due from her has been paid.
4. A student admitted after the beginning of a term should pay the whole fees for the term even if she has paid the fees in some other college, and it is left to the discretion of the principal to extend any concession in deserving cases.
5. If a student discontinues her study, a transfer certificate will be issued on request, with a payment of Rs.5, provided, she applies for the same not later than the fifth working day of the succeeding term after leaving the college.
6. If a student leaves the college at the end of an academic year, she is entitled to receive the attendance certificate required by the university if she applies for it.

Rules of Discipline

1. Students should not use cell phones during class hours.
2. Day scholars using two wheelers should wear helmet, failing which they will not be permitted to park their vehicles inside the campus.
3. Students are directed to look up the notice boards every day.
4. Scribbling on the walls, desks or any other kind of damage to college property is strictly prohibited. Students responsible for such damages will be severely punished.
5. Students are advised to avoid usage of Plastic products inside campus.
6. Clean & hygienic practices and conservation of water should be strictly followed by the students.
7. The campus is under CCTV surveillance and the movements of students are monitored.

Rules of Attendance

1. No student may absent herself from the college without proper reasons. Application for leave must be handed over to the Principal and it should be counter signed by the HOD concerned. When the absence is due to unforeseen causes, an application for leave must be submitted as early as possible, and in no case later than the first day of return to the college. The leave applied for, in time will ordinarily be granted when proper reasons are given but in case of sickness extending for more than three days, submission of a medical certificate is obligatory.
2. If a student absents herself for a week without submitting a leave application, her name may be struck off in the rolls unless she shows that her failure to obtain leave was unavoidable.
3. A student who is absent for any part of the morning/afternoon session will be considered absent for half-a-day unless the Principal is satisfied with the reasons given for the absence.
4. One day absence without leave letter will be considered as two days of absence unless the Principal is satisfied with the reasons given for the absence and grants leave. 75% attendance for each course paper is the minimum eligibility to sit for the ESE.
5. A candidate who has secured less than 65% of attendance in any Semester will not be permitted to take the regular examinations.
6. A candidate who has lack of attendance (65% - 75%) can apply for condonation only once during their period of study.
7. Each Student has to select an extra-curricular activity - Physical Education/NCC/NSS/YUVA/YRC/Rotaract /Eco Watch/ Yoga Club/e-cell, Quiz Club/Consumer Club, Gender Championship Club, Uyir Club
8. Terminal examination will ordinarily be held at the end of each semester. Except for very special cases, students will not be allowed to absent themselves for these examinations. Two Continuous Assessment (CA) tests and a Model Examination will be conducted for each course in every semester. Tentative dates are provided in the calendar. Reports of each student will be available at the end of every semester on our website.

GRG Centenary Sports Arena is located in the PSGR Krishnammal College for Women, Coimbatore. It is exclusively for the Indoor games and fitness gymnasium. It includes classy synthetic court for Badminton, Basketball, Volleyball, Table Tennis, Boxing and Yoga with electronic score boards. The centenary sports arena ceiling is now packed up into a work of Art with a custom-covered hanging ceiling baffle to stop the echo. Entire arena is hanged up with resin-hardened, acoustic baffles that give an excellent ceiling sound proofing for the clear audio visualization. It also includes the Hi-tech equipments for the first aid section. All the Indoor games equipments were imported from USA in high quality including safety measures. It is equipped with a 1500 seating gallery, lockers, warehouse, furnished dormitories, electronic score board, CCTV, an Air conditioned VIP room and rest rooms. It also has the comforts of Air-conditioned VIP room with attached pantry.

There are convenient rest rooms with lockers separately for Team I, Team II and Ladies Spectators and for Gents Spectators. Special highlighted feature inside the convenience are the provision given to physically challenged person's rest room. Sports Arena includes warehouse to store the sports equipments and materials. Furnished Dormitory is available for the outstation teams to provide accommodation during tournaments. Electronic score board is available for Basketball game for scoring. The Arena has CCTV (Closed Circuit Television) system in which signals are not publicly distributed but are monitored, primarily for surveillance and security purpose.

To support and takeover the joint initiative of the Ministry of women and Child Development and Ministry of Human Resource Development, PSGR Krishnammal College for Women formed Gender Champion Club in 2016 Coordinated by Centre for Women'sStudies.

Gandhian Studies Centre

The centre aims to impart the Gandhian vision of total upliftment of the underprivileged rural women to enable them to live with human dignity and to realize their identity. Gandhian Studies Centre acts as a nodal centre to inculcate Gandhian thoughts and principles among the younger generation to make them good citizens of India and also to deliver multifaceted functions like teaching, extension, advocacy, networking, documentation and research.

Dr. Ambedkar Studies Centre

The Centre aims to incorporate Dr.Ambedkar's thoughts and to create awareness in students about their rights and promote women empowerment through higher education. It also envisages to widen into a centre for national integration of students and helps to develop an all India perspective.

Centre for Career Development

The focused vision of this center is to provide social justice to narrow down the gap of students belonging to SC/ST, OBC,

minorities, physically challenged, etc and to develop them socially and educationally competent. This center promotes not only in higher education but helps students to choose teaching as their career and to get gainful employment in state services, central services or equivalent positions in the private sector by organizing coaching classes with the assistance of subject experts and resource persons both from the institution and out sourcing.

ACS Coaching Centre

To encourage and motivate the students to become professionals, our college has been conducting coaching classes for ACS from the academic year 2009-2010 onwards. The regular classes are arranged from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm on all working days. Also, classes are arranged on holidays whenever necessary. Classes are arranged for all three levels viz CSEET, Executive and Professional. Resource persons with rich experience from industry, profession and academics are appointed to handle classes.

CA Coaching Centre

Our college is accredited by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India for conducting coaching classes for CA Foundation from the academic year 2009-10. The classes are scheduled from 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm for all the students.

CMA Coaching Centre

Our college is accredited by the Institute of Cost and Management Accountants of India for conducting coaching classes for CMA Foundation and Intermediate from the academic year 2012-13. The classes for Self-Financing students are scheduled from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm on all week days and from 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm for aided students.

ACCA

Aided and Self-Finance Programmes in B.Com stream is accredited with Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA), UK. Students enrolled in these Programmes get globally recognized Chartered Accountancy degree from UK. All the Courses under B.Com stream are integrated and students will get exemption up to 6 ACCA papers where they need to pass only 7 papers to qualify the same. Classes are conducted in PSGRKCW campus. 100% placement support for qualifying students. The Qualified students can hold an advisory role in the field of Tax, Audit, Accounting and Finance.

Remedial Coaching Scheme

UGC sponsored remedial coaching at undergraduate and postgraduate level for (i) SC/ST students and (ii) students belonging to minority communities is provided mainly to improve the academic skills, linguistic proficiency and level of comprehension.

Regional Centre in Geriatric Care

Our Institution is recognized as a "Regional Centre in Geriatric Care" by National Institute of Social Defense, New Delhi, an autonomous body of Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment. The Regional Centre in Geriatric Care conducts short term courses such as two months, three month and six months course in old age care, five days training on Geriatric Counselling, dementia Care training programmes and sensitization programmes to bridge Inter-generational Gap. Placement is provided to students in old age home, hospitals and home care units etc. This Centre works for socially and educationally related assignments sponsored by Central Government schemes on "Inclusiveness with equal access to all".

GRG – Innovation & Entrepreneurship Development Centre (GRG-IEDC)

Innovation & Entrepreneurship Development Centre (IEDC) of PSGRKC supported by National Science & Technology Entrepreneurship Development Board (NSTEDB) which comes under Department of Science & Technology (DST), Govt. of India was established in August 2009. The Centre intends to inculcate a spirit of entrepreneurship and business leadership among the students. The main objective of the centre is to impart soft skills, trade specific skills and entrepreneurship training & Empowerment of women through financial independence. Entrepreneurship Awareness Camps (EAC) is conducted on a regular basis by the IEDC of the college.

E-Cell

The Entrepreneurship Cell (E-Cell) has been started in the college which encourages, educates and facilitates students who become members to turn out to be entrepreneurs through its entrepreneurial activities and programmes. Campus Company an entrepreneurial venture "Magical Shades" and "Vogue & Style" started by the students within the campus provides opportunities for the students to develop entrepreneurial knowledge and skills through personal experience of establishing, managing, and operating a venture.

The college is registered as member under MHRD's Innovation cell (MIC) which conducts various innovation and entrepreneurship-related activities prescribed by the Govt. of India in a time bound fashion. The innovation cell organizes webinars, IPR and cognitive skills workshops, many Hackathons, Idea competitions, mini-challenge programmes and innovative product competitions, etc.

To impart entrepreneurial skills and to encourage innovative start-up business ventures, the e-cell works in association with the Entrepreneurship Development and Innovation Institute (EDII), Tamil Nadu. The college provides a foundation course on Introduction to Entrepreneurship and has motivated many students to become successful entrepreneurs through participation in various skill oriented programmes.

The sessions are recorded and indexed so that it is available to the students for later reference.

My Classroom

This Social learning platform addresses the needs of the learner through effective engagement rather than being just a collection of feature sets and repository of context.

GRG Hostel

The hostel is situated nearly 2 kilometers away from the college. It accommodates more than 2000 members inclusive of additional hostels (students & teachers). The hostel is under the direct control of the Secretary who is its Chief Warden. She is vested with powers to interpret and enforce the rules and is assisted by a warden. The warden guides the deputy wardens and matrons in the day today administration. The approval of the chief warden will be required for creating or changing the rules.

Hostel Rules

1. Students are not allowed to go out of the hostel without the written permission of the warden.

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2. No student shall stay outside the hostel for the night without the written permission from the parent or guardian.
 3. A student is permitted to go home only on 'General Permission' declared twice a month. Students must return to the hostel on Sundays before 6.00pm.
 4. Hostel students shall not absent themselves from the college without submitting leave letters counter signed by the warden.
 5. Visitors are permitted to meet the inmates on Saturdays, Sundays and national holidays between 10.00am to 5.30pm. Visitors must register their name and furnish relevant details in the visitors register.
 6. Members shall not disturb others and shall in no way interfere with the work of other inmates.
 7. Study hours (7.30 pm. to 10.15 pm) must be strictly observed and as soon as the silence hour is struck they shall be at their studies. Students must remain in their respective rooms during these hours and switch off the lights by 10.30pm.
 8. Misconduct or breach of hostel rules renders the offender liable to fine or suspension or dismissal from both the hostel and college.
 9. Members shall not issue any order to the hostel servants and shall not interfere with their work.
 10. Mis-behaviour on the part of the servants and residents shall be reported to the deputy warden immediately with all particulars. The members are not permitted to take any direct measures.
 11. Members or their guests shall not enter the kitchen without permission.
 12. The chief warden may refuse admission to the hostel or

- expel from the hostel any member without assigning any reason.
13. The chief warden may refuse admission to the hostel or expel from the hostel any member without assigning any reason.
 14. Members of the hostel who want to leave the hostel must give a written notice of their intention at least a week before the date of leaving.
 15. Students are not allowed to go out for any reason after punching the attendance.
 16. Day scholars taking food without token should pay Rs.500/- as fine. The hosteler accompanying the day scholar involved in such incident should also pay Rs.500/- as fine.
 17. The students must enter the details in the outgoing register while going out of the campus.
 18. Wards are instructed to fill up "IN" time only after returning from the outings.
 19. Cell phones are permitted only inside the rooms and not in common areas.
 20. Students are instructed to punch the attendance before going out in case of general permission and special permission.
 21. Students who are vacating in between should pay the administrative charges of the remaining months for that academic year.
 22. Students should stay in their allotted rooms. If they stay in others rooms, they should pay a fine of Rs100/- for each day.
 23. Students are advised to get prior permission from the HOI/HOD/ Warden to go out from the college for reasons such as industry visit, project work, extra classes, sponsorship, etc.

24. Students who are taking leave for more than three days with permission will be eligible to get mess reduction. But they should pay the administration charges for the entire leave period.
