### UGC - SPONSORED B.Voc. DEGREE PROGRAMMES

Vocational or skill-based education is becoming more and more significant in the present scenario. B.Voc (Bachelor of Vocation) is an emerging course in India that aims at providing adequate skills required for a particular trade to candidates. The course is different from traditional academic programmes as it deals more with skill-based studies rather than focusing on only theoretical knowledge.

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has launched a scheme on skills development based higher education as part of college/university education, leading to Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) Degree with multiple exits such as Diploma/Advanced Diploma under the National Skill Qualification Frame work (NSQF). The B.Voc. # CHANDRAKANTHI CENTRE FOR DEVELOPMENT AND EXCELLENCE

To equip future generation for their successful employment and develop their personality along with their academies, Personality Development Program has been introduced for all three years. First Year program is split into two modules I Semester - Communicative English (40 Hours) & II Semester Effective English Communication (30Hours). Second Year- General Aptitude for Campus Placement (40 Hours). Third year - Soft skill for Campus Placement (40 Hours). Final Year Placement registered students undergo a special training program for 30 hours "Campus to Corporate Connect".

#### I Year - 40 Hours

Communicative English: This program is a bridge program for I semester; students who are screened by class in charge based on their language skill (written and verbal). The course covers basic grammar and Spoken English.

Effective English Communication: This program is for entire I year. The course covers Verbal Aptitude.

#### II Year - 40 Hours

Aptitude & Soft skill for Campus placement is given for entire second year. The course covers Quantitative Aptitude, Logical Reasoning, and Verbal Aptitude.

#### III Year - 40 Hours

Soft skill & career guidance for Campus Placement is given for entire third years. The course covers Resume Writing, Group Discussion, Grooming, Body Language, and Communication.

#### PG-24 Hours

Training on Soft skill and aptitude shortcuts.

#### **Campus to Corporate Connect**

Placement registered students undergo this program; experts from industry train the students on interview preparation.

#### **CENTRE FOR E-RESOURCES**

The centre aims at high-quality plan of the whole instructional approach of the various programmes offered in the college in tune with National Programme on Technology Education Learning. The e-contents with combination of sounds, images and text prepared by our faculty members provide free online video lectures in science and humanity courses and are made available in learning management portal 24x7 to our students.

#### LANGUAGE LAB

PSGR Krishnammal College for Women established the Language Lab in the year 2008, which is a language training platform to maximize practical learning of language and language-oriented skills. Lady Hawk software is installed in the lab to expand activity based learning amidst first and second year students of under graduation. Every year, around 3500 students get benefitted by getting trained through the language software to learn various languages like English, French and German. Language Lab allows students to practice language with a much wider variety of activities and exercises using online modules. Different modes of activities like audio exercises, video exercises and audio-visual materials are programmed to equip the users. The students watch videos, practice their pronunciation through a speech recognizer, learn new vocabulary, and work out the grammatical tasks and they can also have a record of their scores. The platform is tailored to the individual needs of students. On the other hand, the monitoring and evaluation pattern are incorporated into the system and the teacher can identify the areas of difficulties students encounter during the course of language learning process.

#### **GRG BIRAC E YUVA CENTRE**

GRG BIRAC E YUVA Centre, supported by BIRAC, Government of India, is established to promote entrepreneurial innovation among young students and researchers. PSGR Krishnammal College for Women is the only Women's college among 10 BIRAC E YUVA centres in India to be supported under this scheme. With 3 Postdoctoral Innovation Fellows and 25 Under graduate E YUVA Fellows working towards Bio-Startups and patents in the fields of enzyme technology, waste valorization, healthcare, and food technology; the main motive of the centre is to create a culture of research innovation and capacity building at the undergraduate student level in academic institutions, opportunity creation and access for Life-science Entrepreneurship.

#### DBT-BUILDER (Level -1)

PSGR Krishnammal College for Women has been sanctioned with a grant of Rs.1.2 crores to establish **DBT-BUILDER – PSGR Krishnammal College for Women - Interdisciplinary Life Science Programme for Advance Research and Education** under the "Boost to University Interdisciplinary Life science Departments for Education and Research (BUILDER – Level-1)" Programme for advanced research and education by the Department of Biotechnology (DBT) Ministry of Science and Technology, Government of India. The DBT – BUILDER grant will be utilised to promote

interdisciplinary teaching and research in Plant derived exosomes as effective drug delivery system. The funding supports Enhancement of Infrastructure and Human Resources. The DBT-BUILDER augmented infrastructure facilities will immensely benefit masters and research students, and facilitate high-end research, enhance the skill sets of student, teaching learning process and interdisciplinary research and help empower women in the field of life sciences.

The Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, Government of India has constituted the National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) for skill development in both the public and private sectors. Apparels, Made-ups and Home Furnishings Skill Sector Council (AMHSSC), New Delhi, has been authorized by NSDC for evolving assessing proficiencies of skills of trainees for the apparel sector, made-ups and home furnishing in their respective subject areas. The AMHSSC has approved the setting up of a Center of Excellence for Apparels, Made-ups and Home Furnishings in PSGR Krishnammal College for Woman, Coimbatore and sanctioned a sum of Rs. 2.11 crore rupees for related machinery and equipment. The main objectives of the COE is skill development for students and society through short term and certificate programs, research and market analysis, student and industry projects, NSDC assessments, training of trainers and other programs in collaboration with AMHSSC, New Delhi.

Our educational programmes are designed to equip students with the knowledge, skills and expertise needed to tackle the pressing challenges faced by the society today. The Centre of Excellence in Life Sciences is equipped with state-of-the-art infrastructure to support cutting-edge research and innovation in the field of life sciences. Our facilities include advanced laboratory equipment, high-performance computational biology and biotechnology lab. The centre takes pride in providing an excellent eco system to facilitate advanced research in the areas of life science.

#### CENTRE FOR INNOVATION, INCUBATION AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT (CIIED)

CIIED was launched in August 2020 to bring together all the entrepreneurship related activities of the institution under one umbrella. Over years, CIIED has been instrumental in creating a vibrant entrepreneurial ecosystem in the campus through various interventions aimed at providing entrepreneurship awareness, education, training, mentoring and other support to potential students. The vision of CIIED is to create confident and successful women entrepreneurs who will become contributing members of the society and thereby play a significant role in nation building.

The Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) was established under the aegis of MoE in November 2018. # **Rules of Admission / Withdrawal**

- 1. Candidates for admission to the degree class should have passed the XII Standard or Pre-Degree examination or its equivalent declared eligible by the Bharathiar University for admission to the degree course.
- 2. Students who are found to have obtained admission by false representations will be dismissed with forfeiture of all fees paid.
- 3. No student will be enrolled or permitted to attend classes until the fee due from her has been paid.
- 4. A student admitted after the beginning of a term should pay the whole fees for the term even if she has paid the fees in some other college, and it is left to the discretion of the principal to extend any concession in deserving cases.
- 5. If a student discontinues her study, a transfer certificate will be issued on request, with a payment of ₹ 5, provided, she applies for the same not later than the fifth working day of the succeeding term after leaving the college.
- 6. If a student leaves the college at the end of an academic year, she is entitled to receive the attendance certificate required by the university if she applies for it.

# **Rules of Discipline**

- 1. Students should not use cell phones during class hours.
- 2. Day scholars using two wheelers should wear helmet, failing which they will not be permitted to park their vehicles inside the campus.
- 3. Students are directed to look up the notice boards every day.
- 4. Scribbling on the walls, desks or any other kind of damage to college property is strictly prohibited. Students responsible for such damages will be severely punished.
- 5. Students are advised to avoid usage of Plastic products inside campus.
- 6. Clean & hygienic practices and conservation of water should be strictly followed by the students.
- 7. The campus is under CCTV surveillance and the movements of students are monitored.

## **Rules of Attendance**

- 1. No student may absent herself from the college without proper reasons. Application for leave must be handed over to the Principal and it should be counter signed by the HOD concerned. When the absence is due to unforeseen causes, an application for leave must be submitted as early as possible, and in no case later than the first day of return to the college. The leave applied for, in time will ordinarily be granted when proper reasons are given but in case of sickness extending for more than three days, submission of a medical certificate is obligatory.
- 2. If a student absents herself for a week without submitting a leave application, her name may be struck off in the rolls unless she shows that her failure to obtain leave was unavoidable.
- 3. A student who is absent for any part of the morning/afternoon session will be considered absent for half-a-day unless the Principal is satisfied with the reasons given for the absence.
- 4. One day absence without leave letter will be considered as two days of absence unless the Principal is satisfied with the reasons given for the absence and grants leave. 75% attendance for each course paper is the minimum eligibility to sit for the End Semester Examinations.
- 5. A candidate who has secured less than 65% of attendance in any Semester will not be permitted to take the regular examinations.
- 6. A candidate who has lack of attendance (65% 75%) can apply for condonation only once during their period of study.
- Each Student has to select an extra-curricular activity Physical Education / NCC / NSS / YUVA / YRC / Rotaract / EcoWatch / Yoga Club / e-cell, Quiz Club / Consumer Club / Gender Championship Club / Uyir Club / Health Care / WBCC.
- 8. Terminal examination will ordinarily be held at the end of each semester. Except for very special cases, students will not be allowed to absent themselves for these examinations. Two Continuous Assessment (CA) tests and a Model Examination will be conducted for each course in every semester. Tentative dates are provided in the calendar. Students' reports will be available at the end of every semester in our college website.

#### **REMEDIAL COACHING SCHEME**

UGC sponsored remedial coaching at undergraduate and postgraduate level for (i)SC/ST students and (ii)students belonging to minority communities is provided mainly to improve the academic skills, linguistic proficiency and level of comprehension.

#### **REGIONAL CENTRE IN GERIATRIC CARE**

Our Institution is recognized as a "Regional Centre in Geriatric Care" by National Institute of Social Defense, New Delhi, an autonomous body of Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment. The Regional Centre in Geriatric Care conducts short term courses such as two months, three month and six months course in old age care, five days training on Geriatric Counseling, dementia care training programmes functionaries working in old age home and NGO's and sensitization programmes to bridge Inter-generational Gap for school and college student. After successful completion of the short term courses, placement is provided to students in old age home, hospitals and home care units etc. This Centre works for socially and educationally related assignments sponsored by Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, New Delhi.

PSGR Krishnammal College for Women Alumni Association nurtures the spirit of allegiance and loyalty and promotes the general welfare of the College by strengthening the bond between the alumni, the community and the Institution. It associates itself with the student community by awarding the Best Outgoing Student every year with a gold medal. It also recognizes students for their academic and extra-curricular excellence. The Association is also a forum where the alumni come back to the college as resource persons to share their experience of success and as mentors to help the young minds in realizing their dreams. #### **A-VIEW FACILITY**

Amrita Virtual Interactive E-learning World (A-View) is a frame work that provides a rich interactive social environment for e-learning in educational corporate, entertainment and other applications. A - View is a compact and highly flexible software with an objective to provide a platform for sharing values, resources and knowledge of excellent teachers from allover the world to the students through EDUSAT network/internet. The A-View plat form involves multiple displays which will give students unhindered and uninterrupted view of slides, white board and other multimedia materials apart from teachers' audio/video. The sessions are recorded and indexed so that it is available to the students for later reference.

#### TECHNICAL SKILLS

Software Training / CCNA (Cisco Certified Network Associate) / MSCX /Linux/Enterprise Application Development using JAVA/Software Testing/Programming in ASP. NET/Data Warehousing/Software Project Management are provided.

#### SOFTS SKILLS

As a part of the curriculum, developments through communication skills, placement support program, group discussion & personal interviews are provided as a package to all the students. Coaching for MBA Entrance Exam (CAT), GRE, TOFEL, IELTS are available.

#### OFFICE OF INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

The primary objective of the Office of International Relations (OIR) at KCW is to seek and forge international alliances and collaborative partnerships with premier institutions abroad; to enable and facilitate joint faculty research and publication; to promote faculty and students' mobility through short term immersion programmes, co-teaching, sabbatical; and, to offer twinning, progression, and similar programmes of study.

KCW currently has collaborative partnerships with San Diego State University, University of Michigan-Dearborn, University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Binghamton University and Oregon State University in the USA; CETYS University in Mexico; Nottingham Trent University in the UK; James Cook University in Singapore; Asia Pacific University, Universiti Malaysia Pahang, and Swinburne University of Technology, Sarawak Campus in Malaysia; and, University of Dar Es Salaam in Tanzania.

During the past five years, 25+ faculty and 350+ students have travelled to our partner institutions to attend global immersion programmes, to deliver seminars, to teach classes, and to participate in conferences. Our faculty have also engaged in co-teaching and digital (virtual) delivery of courses to international students.

OIR also coordinates and participates in International Education Fairs organised by Ministry of Education through Study in India programme in Nepal, Bhutan, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Tanzania, Zambia, Ethiopia and other countries. This is aimed at admitting students from these countires to enhance the geographic, social, cultural and ethinc diversity of KCW student population

#### **RESEARCH & DEVELOPMENT CELL**

The institution takes pride and pleasure in publishing peer- reviewed, registered biannual journal "Advances in Applied Research" since June 2009, bearing the International Standard Serial Number (ISSN) 0974 - 3839 (Print ISSN) and 2349-2104 (Online ISSN) for the Fifteenth year in succession. The National Academy of Agricultural Sciences (NAAS) rating for our journal is 3.21. The journal is also recognized by the Science and Engineering Research Board (SERB) under DST.



## **GRG Hostel**

The hostel is situated nearly 2 kilometers away from the college. It accommodates more than 2000 members inclusive of additional hostels (students & teachers). The hostel is under the direct control of the Secretary who is its Chief Warden. She is vested with powers to interpret and enforce the rules and is assisted by a warden. The warden guides the deputy wardens and matrons to manage the day-to-day administration.

#### **Hostel Rules**

- 1. Students are not allowed to go out of the hostel without the written permission of the warden.
- 2. No student shall stay outside the hostel for the night without the written permission from the parent or guardian.
- 3. Students are permitted to go home only on 'General Permission' declared twice a month. Students must return to the hostel on Sundays before 6.00 pm.
- 4. Hostel students shall not absent themselves from the college without submitting leave letters counter signed by the warden.
- 5. Visitors are permitted to meet the inmates on Saturdays, Sundays and National holidays between 09.00 am to 5.30 pm. Visitors must register their name and furnish relevant details in the visitors register.
- 6. Members shall not disturb others and shall in no way interfere with the work of other inmates.
- 7. Students should switch off their room lights by 10.30 pm. They can make use of study hall after that if needed.
- 8. Misconduct or breach of hostel rules renders the offender liable to fine or suspension or dismissal from both the hostel and college.
- 9. Members shall not issue any order to the hostel servants and shall not interfere with their work.
- 10. Misbehavior on the part of the servants and residents shall be reported to the deputy warden immediately with all particulars. The members are not permitted to take any direct measures.

- 11. Members of the hostel who want to leave the hostel must give a written notice of their intention at least a week before the date of leaving except on emergency.
- 12. Students are not allowed to go out for any reason after punching the attendance.
- 13. Day scholars taking food without token should pay Rs. 500/- as fine. The hosteler accompanying the day scholar involved in such incident should also pay Rs.500/- as fine.
- 14. The students must enter the details in the outgoing register while going out of the campus.
- 15. Wards are instructed to fill up "IN" time only after returning from the outings.
- 16. Cell phones are permitted only inside the rooms and not in common areas.
- 17. Students are instructed to punch the attendance before going out in case of general permission and special permission.
- 18. Students who are vacating in between should pay the administrative charges of the remaining months for that academic year.
- 19. Students should stay in their allotted rooms. If they stay in others rooms, they should pay a fine of Rs.100/-for each day.
- 20. Students are advised to get prior permission from the HOI/HOD/ Warden to go out from the college for reasons such as industry visit, project work, extra classes, sponsorship, etc.
- 21. Students who are taking leave for more than nine days with permission will be eligible to get mess reduction. But they should pay the administration charges for the entire leave period.
- 22. Hostellers coming as days scholar without permission from principal are not eligible for mess reduction.
